











Step 1: Preparing the Power Supply

The camcorder can be powered by a battery pack or be connected to a household power source. Charge the battery pack before use.

Attaching the Battery Pack

- 1. Turn the POWER switch to OFF .
- 2. Open the LCD panel.
- 3. Attach the battery pack to the camcorder.
 - Remove the terminal cover of the battery pack.
 - Slide in the connector end of the battery in the direction of the arrow and press it gently until it clicks.

To remove the battery pack:

- 1. Open the LCD panel.
- 2. Hold down the BATTERY RELEASE button and pull out the battery from the ridge on its bottom part.


Charging the Battery Pack


- 1. Connect the power cord to the adapter.
- 2. Plug the power cord into a power outlet.
- 3. Open the front terminal cover and connect the power adapter to the camcorder's DC IN terminal.

The CHARGE indicator starts flashing. The indicator will stay on when the charging is completed.

To remove the power adapter:

- 1. Disconnect the power adapter from the camcorder.
- 2. Unplug the power cord from the power outlet.






3. Disconnect the power cord from the adapter.

Using a Household Power Source

Connect to a household power source to use the camcorder without worrying about the battery power. You can keep the battery pack attached; the battery power will not be consumed.

- 1. Turn the POWER switch to OFF .
- 2. Connect the power cord to the power adapter.
- 3. Plug the power cord into a power outlet.
- 4. Open the front terminal cover and connect the power adapter to the camcorder's DC IN terminal.





- O Turn off the camcorder before connecting or disconnecting the power adapter.
 O Do not connect any products that are not expressly recommended to the camcorder's DC IN terminal or to the power adapter.
- O You may hear some noise from the power adapter during use. This is not a malfunction.
- Do not disconnect and reconnect the power cord while charging a battery pack. Charging may stop. The battery pack may not be charged correctly even if the CHARGE indicator is continuously on. The battery pack may also not be charged correctly when a power outage occurs during charging. Remove the battery pack and attach it back to the camcorder.



O When the power adapter or battery pack is defective, the CHARGE indicator flashes rapidly (at about 2 flashes/second) and the charging stops.

 The CHARGE indicator informs you about the charge status.
 0-50%: Flashes once every second More than 50%: Flashes twice every second 100%: Continuously on

- O We recommend charging the battery pack in temperatures between 10°C and 30°C (50°F and 86°F). Outside the temperature range of 0 °C to 40 °C (32 °F to 104 °F) the charging will not start. If the battery temperature goes outside this temperature range while charging, the CHARGE indicator will start flashing rapidly and the charging will stop.
- O A lithium ion battery pack can be charged at any charge state. Unlike conventional battery packs, you do not need to completely use or discharge it before charging.
- O To conserve battery power, turn off the camcorder instead of leaving it in record pause mode.
- O We recommend that you prepare battery packs 2 to 3 times longer than you think you might need.


Step 2: Loading a Cassette


Use only videocassettes marked with the MON logo.

 Slide the OPEN/EJECT ▲ switch and open the cassette compartment cover.

The cassette compartment opens automatically.

- 2. Load the cassette.
 - Load the cassette with the window facing the grip belt.
 - Unload the cassette by pulling it straight out.
- 3. Press the PUSH mark on the cassette compartment until it clicks.
- 4. Wait for the cassette compartment to retract automatically and close the cassette compartment cover.







O Do not interfere with the cassette compartment while it is opening or closing automatically, or attempt to close the cover before the cassette compartment has fully retracted.

O Be careful not to get your fingers caught in the cassette compartment cover.



If the camcorder is connected to a power source, cassettes can be loaded/ unloaded even if the **POWER** switch is set to **OFF**. Ε

Step 3: Inserting a Memory Card

You can use commercially available *SP* SD memory cards or MultiMediaCards (MMC) with this camcorder.

Inserting the Card

- 1. Set the POWER switch to OFF .
- 2. Open the cover.
- 3. Insert the memory card straight into the memory card slot and push it in until it clicks.
- 4. Close the cover.


If the memory card is not correctly inserted the cover will not close – do not forcefully close the cover. Verify that the memory card is inserted in the correct direction.


5. Turn on the camcorder.

Removing the Card

Do not forcefully remove the memory card without first pushing it in.

- 1. Set the POWER switch to OFF. Make sure that the CARD access indicator is not flashing before you turn off the camcorder.
- 2. Open the cover.
- 3. Push the memory card to release it. Remove the memory card.
- 4. Close the cover.







O Before using them, make sure to initialize all memory cards with this camcorder (
 85).

O Memory cards have front and back sides that are not interchangeable. Inserting a memory card facing the wrong direction can cause a malfunction of the camcorder.






Inserting the Battery (Lithium Button Battery CR2025)

- 1. Press the tab in the direction of the arrow and pull out the battery holder.
- 2. Place the lithium button battery with the + side facing up.
- 3. Insert the battery holder.



Using the Wireless Controller

Point it at the camcorder's remote sensor when you press the buttons.






- O The wireless controller may not work properly when the remote sensor is subjected to strong light sources or direct sunlight.
- O If the wireless controller does not work, check if the remote sensor is set to [OFF (\mathfrak{W}] (\mathfrak{m} 68).
- O When the camcorder cannot be operated with the wireless controller, or when it can only be operated at very close range, replace the battery.


Step 6: Installing the Backup Battery

The backup battery (lithium button battery CR1616) allows the camcorder to retain the date, time (\Box 26) and other camcorder settings while the power source is disconnected. Connect a power source to the camcorder when replacing the backup battery to retain the settings.

- 1. Open the memory slot/backup battery compartment cover.
- 2. Pull out the backup battery holder using a flat screwdriver or a similar tool.
- 3. Insert the backup battery in the holder with the + side facing down.



4. Insert the battery holder and push it in until it clicks, then close the cover.






The backup battery has a life span of about a year. " $\stackrel{+}{\backsim}$ " flashes in red to inform you that it needs to be replaced.

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Step 7: Adjusting the LCD Screen

Rotating the LCD Panel



Open the LCD panel 90 degrees.


- You can rotate the panel downward by 90 degrees.
- You can rotate the panel by 180 degrees toward the lens (allowing the subject to monitor the LCD screen while you use the viewfinder).
- When the LCD screen is facing the subject, the LCD image will be reversed right-left and the subject will see a mirror image. In the LCD mirror mode, only the tape and card operation and the self-timer displays will appear on the LCD screen. All displays will appear normally on the viewfinder screen.



Rotating the panel by 180 degrees is also useful if you wish to include yourself when recording with the self-timer (\square 52).

LCD Backlight

You can switch the brightness of the LCD screen between normal and bright by pressing the LCD BACKLIGHT button. This is useful for outdoor recordings.



Press the LCD BACKLIGHT button.

The brightness changes with each press of the button.



- O This setting does not affect the brightness of the recording or the viewfinder screen.
- O When using a battery pack, the camcorder retains the setting even if you change the position of the **POWER** switch.
- O The battery usage time shortens when the LCD screen is set brighter.

Step 8: Changing the Display Language

The language used in the camcorder displays and menu items can be changed. A different set of languages will be available with your camcorder, depending on the area where you acquired it.


Recording Movies on a Tape

Before You Begin Recording

Make a test recording first to check if the camcorder operates correctly. If necessary, clean the video heads (\square 120).

- 1. Holding the lock button on the **POWER** switch pressed down, set the switch to CAMERA.
- 2. Set the TAPE/CARD switch to \overline{co} .
- 3. Open the lens cover (move the lens cover switch down to \bigcirc).
- 4. Press the start/stop button to begin recording.

Press the start/stop button again to pause recording.



When You Have Finished Recording


- 1. Turn the POWER switch to OFF.
- 2. Close the lens cover (move the lens cover switch to ⊜).
- 3. Unload the cassette.
- 4. Disconnect the power source.
- 5. Close the LCD panel.



- O Wait until the tape counter stops completely before you start recording.
- O When you do not remove the cassette, you can record the next scene without producing any noise or blank sections between the recordings even if you turn the camcorder off.
- O Bright light may make it difficult to use the LCD screen. In such case, use the viewfinder instead.
- O When recording near loud sounds (such as fireworks, drums or concerts), the sound may become distorted or may be recorded not in the actual sound level. This is not a malfunction.
- The camcorder enters the stop mode (■) after 4 minutes 30 seconds when left in record pause mode (● ■) to protect the tape and video heads. In stop mode, press the start/stop button to start recording.

- When powered by a battery pack, the camcorder shuts off to save power
 (□ 68) if left without any operation for 5 minutes. Approximately 30 seconds before the camcorder shuts off the message "▲ AUTO POWER OFF" will appear. If the camcorder shuts off, turn the POWER switch to
 OTE and back on again.
- O About the LCD and viewfinder screen: The screens are produced with extremely high-precision manufacturing techniques, with more than 99.99% of the pixels operating to specification. Less than 0.01% of the pixels may occasionally misfire or appear as black or green dots. This has no effect on the recorded image and does not constitute a malfunction.

Screen Displays during Recording



1 Time Code

Indicates the recording time in hours, minutes and seconds.

2 Remaining tape

Indicates the remaining time of the tape in minutes. "" moves during recording. " END" flashes when the tape reaches the end.

- When the time left is less than 15 seconds, the remaining tape time may not appear.
- Depending on the type of the tape, the indication may not be displayed correctly.

3 Recording reminder

The camcorder counts from 1 to 10 seconds when you start recording. This is helpful to avoid scenes that are too short.






O About the focusing frame:





Zooming

The zoom is available in the $(\underline{CAMERA \cdot \Box})$ and $(\underline{CAMERA \cdot \Box})$ modes. When recording on the tape, in addition to the optical zoom you can also use the digital zoom (\Box 65).

 - MIX/VAR.: Plays back Stereo 1 and Stereo 2. The mix balance can be adjusted.
 - If you select an audio setting other than [MIX/VAR.], close the menu.

To adjust the mix level when you select [MIX/VAR.]:

- 4. From the [AUDIO SETUP] menu select (▲▼) the [MIX BALANCE] option and press (❀).





You can transfer recordings to a computer using the IEEE1394 (DV) terminal.

You can also use this camcorder to transfer through it recordings from an analog VCR or 8 mm camcorder to your computer using the USB terminal (see Converting Analog Signals into Digital Signals (
 92)).

Before starting the video transferring, make sure to prepare the following:

- O A computer equipped with a IEEE1394 (DV) terminal or a IEEE1394 (DV) capturing board.
- O A DV cable (sold separately)
- **O** Video Editing Software

You can use the video editing software that came bundled with your computer or video capturing board. You can also use the video editing software included with your operating system (Windows Movie Maker with Windows XP and Windows ME, iMovie with Mac OS 9 and later).


O The appropriate driver

A driver is included with Windows operating systems later than Windows 98 Second Edition and Mac operating systems later than Mac OS 9. The driver is installed automatically when you connect the camcorder to the computer.

- 1. Start your computer.
- 2. Set the camcorder to PLAY. mode.
- 3. Check the $[AV \rightarrow DV]$ setting.

If you want to transfer your recordings from the tape, edit the video on the computer and record it back on the tape, set $[AV \rightarrow DV]$ to [OFF]. If you want to convert an analog recording to digital, set $[AV \rightarrow DV]$ to [ON].

4. Connect the camcorder to the computer with the DV cable as shown below.





- O Operation may not work correctly depending on the software and the specifications/settings of your computer.
- O If the computer freezes while you have connected the camcorder, disconnect and reconnect the DV cable. If the problem persists, disconnect the DV cable, turn off both the camcorder and the computer and then turn them back on and reconnect them.

Transferring Memory Card Images to a Computer

With the supplied USB cable and Digital Video Software, you can transfer images recorded on the memory card to the computer by simply pressing the $rac{}_{D} \sim$ (print/share) button.



Moving the camcorder rapidly between hot and cold temperatures may cause condensation (water droplets) to form on its internal surfaces. Stop using the camcorder if condensation is detected. Continued use may damage the camcorder.

Condensation may form in the following cases:

When the camcorder is moved from an air-conditioned room to a warm, humid place

When the camcorder is moved from a cold place to a warm room



When the camcorder is left in a humid





When a cold room is heated rapidly



How to avoid condensation:

O Unload the cassette, place the camcorder in an airtight plastic bag and let it adjust to temperature changes slowly before removing it from the bag.

When condensation is detected:

- O The camcorder stops operating and the warning message "CONDENSATION HAS BEEN DETECTED" appears for approx. 4 seconds and "I arts flashing.
- O If a cassette is loaded, the warning message "REMOVE THE CASSETTE" appears and " " starts flashing. Remove the cassette immediately and leave the cassette compartment open. Leaving the cassette in the camcorder may damage the tape.
- O A cassette cannot be loaded when condensation is detected.

Resuming use:

O It takes about 1 hour until the water droplets evaporate. After the condensation warning stops flashing, wait for 1 more hour before resuming use.

Battery Pack

Treat the battery pack with care.

- · Keep it away from fire (or it might explode).
- Do not expose the battery pack to temperature higher than 60 °C (140 °F). Do not leave it near a heater or inside a car in hot weather.




Cassette

To protect your recordings from accidental erasure, slide the tab on the cassette to SAVE or ERASE OFF.






