Pre-installation Requirements for Canon Facsimile Equipment

A. Location

Supply a suitable table, cabinet, or desk. For the machine's dimensions and weight, see Chapter 11, "Appendix," in the *Basic Guide*.

B. Order Information

- 1. Only a single line, touch-tone or rotary telephone set is to be used.
- 2. Order an RJ11-C modular jack (USOC code), which should be installed by the telephone company. If the RJ11-C jack is not present, installation cannot occur.
- 3. Order a normal business line from your telephone company's business representative. The line should be a regular voice grade line or the equivalent. Use one line per machine.

Canon recommends an individual line following industry standards, e.g., the 2,500 (Touch Tone) or 500 (Rotary/Pulse Dial) telephones. A dedicated extension off a PBX unit without "Call Waiting" can be used with the Color imageCLASS MF8170c. Key telephone systems are not recommended because they send non-standard signals to individual telephones for ringing and special codes, which may cause a fax error.

C. Power Requirements

This equipment should be connected to a standard 120-volt AC, three-wire grounded outlet only. Do not connect this machine to an outlet or power line shared with other appliances that cause "electrical noise." Air conditioners, electric typewriters, copiers, and machines of this sort generate electrical noise which often interferes with communications equipment and the sending and receiving of documents.

Connection of the Equipment

This equipment complies with Part 68 of the FCC rules and the requirements adopted by the ACTA. On the rear panel of this equipment is a label that contains, among other information, a product identifier in the format US:AAAEQ##TXXXX. If requested, this number must be provided to the telephone company.

An FCC compliant telephone cord and modular jack are provided with this equipment. This equipment is designed to be connected to the telephone network or premises wiring using a compatible modular jack which is Part 68 compliant. See Installation instructions for details.

The Ringer Equivalence Number (REN) is used to determine the number of devices that may be connected to a telephone line. Excessive RENs on a telephone line may result in the devices not ringing in response to an incoming call. In most but not all areas, the sum of RENs should not exceed five (5.0). To be certain of the number of devices that may be connected to a line, as determined by the total RENs, contact the local telephone company. The REN for this product is part of the product identifier that has the format US:AAAEQ##TXXXX. The digits represented by ## are the REN without a decimal point (e.g., 10 is a REN of 1.0).

This equipment may not be used on coin service provided by the telephone company. Connection to party lines is subjected to state tariffs.

In Case of Equipment Malfunction

Should any malfunction occur which cannot be corrected by the procedures described in this guide, disconnect the equipment from the telephone line and unplug the power cord. The telephone line should not be reconnected or the power cord plugged in until the problem is completely resolved. Users should contact Canon Authorized Service Facilities for servicing of equipment. Information regarding Canon Authorized Service Facility locations can be obtained by calling the Canon Customer Care Center (1-800-828-4040).

Rights of the Telephone Company

Should the equipment cause harm to the telephone network, the telephone company may temporarily disconnect service. The telephone company also retains the right to make changes in facilities and services which may affect the operation of this equipment. When such changes are necessary, the telephone company is required to give adequate prior notice to the user.

A. Location

Supply a suitable table, cabinet, or desk. For the machine's dimensions and weight, see Chapter 11, "Appendix," in the Basic Guide.

B. Order Information

- 1. Provide only a single-line to touch-tone or rotary telephone set terminated with a standard 4-pin modular phone plug. (Touch-tone is recommended if available in your area.)
- 2. Order an CA11A modular jack, which should be installed by the telephone company. If the CA11A jack is not present, installation cannot occur.
- 3. Order a normal business line from your telephone company's business representative. The line should be a regular voice grade line or equivalent. Use one line per machine.

C. Power Requirements

The power outlet should be a three-prong grounded receptacle (Single or Duplex). It should be independent from copiers, heaters, air conditioners or any electric equipment that is thermostatically controlled. The rated value is 120 volts and 15 amperes. The CA11A modular jack should be relatively close to the power outlet to facilitate installation.

Introduction

This chapter describes the operation panel and the standby display used for the fax function of the machine.

Customer Support


The machine is designed with the latest technology to provide trouble-free operation. Operation Panel

This section describes keys used when sending and receiving faxes, and setting the Menu.

For keys not described here, see Chapter 1, "Introduction," in the Basic Guide.

One-Touch Panel Closed



1) One-Touch Speed Dialing keys (1 to 10)

Dial fax/telephone numbers registered under one-touch speed dialing keys.

2 Redial/Pause key

Redials the previous number dialed manually with the numeric keys, and enters pauses when dialing or registering the numbers.

(3) Directory key

Enables you to search for fax/telephone numbers by the name under which they are registered for speed dialing, and then use the number for dialing.

(4) Coded Dial key

Press [Coded Dial], followed by a two-digit code to dial fax/telephone number registered for coded speed dialing.

(5) Hook key

Enables you to dial without picking up the handset.

(6) In Use/Memory indicator

Lights green when a fax is being received or sent, or the extension phone is off the hook. Flashes green when the reservation of fax transmission is set, or a fax is received into the memory.

(7) FAX key

Switches the standby display to the Fax mode.

8 Menu key

Customizes the way the machine operates.

(9) Alarm indicator

Flashes red when the machine has a problem such as a paper jam. (The error message is displayed in the LCD.)

(10) Exposure key

Adjusts the fax exposure.

(1) Image Quality key

Adjusts the quality of fax image.

(12) Energy Saver key

Sets or cancels the energy saver mode manually. The key lights green when the energy saver mode is set, and goes off when the mode is canceled.

(3) Status Monitor key

Checks the status of copy, fax, print and report jobs.

(14) B&W Start key

Starts sending or receiving faxes.

15) LCD

Displays messages and prompts during operation. Also displays selections, text, and numbers when specifying settings.

(6) Stop/Reset key

Cancels sending or receiving faxes and other operations, and turns to the standby display in the LCD.

(17) Set key

Determines the contents you set or register.


(18) [◄(-)] or [►(+)] keys

Scroll through the selections so you can see other settings.

(19) Numeric keys

Enter numbers when dialing or registering fax/ telephone numbers, etc. Also, enter characters when registering names.

Dial fax/telephone numbers registered under one-touch speed dialing keys.

② Clear key

Clears an entry in the LCD.

Registering Information in Your Machine



This chapter explains how to register the information necessary for sending and receiving faxes.



You can print the USER DATA LIST to check the sender information you have registered. (See "Printing the USER DATA LIST," on p. 6-9.)

Guidelines for Entering Numbers, Letters, and Symbols

Follow this procedure when you come to a step that requires you to enter a name or number.

Press [**] to switch to the uppercase letter mode (:A), lowercase letter mode (:a), or number mode (:1).

You can see what mode you are in by the character indicated on the top right corner of the LCD.



2 Use the numeric keys to enter the character.

Press the key repeatedly until the character you want appears.

- To enter two characters that are under the same key:
 - ☐ Press the numeric key \rightarrow [▶(+)] \rightarrow press the same numeric key again. For example, to enter <DD> you would press [3] \rightarrow [▶(+)] \rightarrow [3].
- To enter a space:
 - ☐ Press [▶(+)].
- To delete a character:
 - ☐ Press [Clear].
- To delete an entire entry:
 - $\hfill \square$ Press and hold [Clear].
- To move a cursor:
 - ☐ Press [**◄**(-)] or [**▶**(+)].


Registering Sender Information

In the United States, FCC rules governing the use of facsimile equipment state that your fax/telephone number, personal name or company name, and date and time of transmission must be printed on every facsimile transmission.

The machine has been designed to print this information at the top of every fax you send.

You must therefore register this information in the machine before using it.

Below is an example of how your sender information will print on a fax sent from the machine:





You can set the sender information to print inside or outside the image area. (See <1. TTI POSITION> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-3.)

Entering the Date and Time



You can print the USER DATA LIST to check the current setting. (See "Printing the USER DATA LIST," on p. 6-9.)

- 1 Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [**4**(-)] or [**▶**(+)] to select <TIMER SETTINGS> → press [Set].
- **3** Press [◄(-)] or [▶ (+)] to select <DATE/TIME SETTING> → press [Set].
- 4 Use the numeric keys to enter the date (month/day/year) and time (in 24-hour format) → press [Set].




Enter only the last two digits of the year.

5 Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.

Registering Your Fax/Telephone Number and Name


- 1 Press [Menu].
- **2** Press $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or $[\blacktriangleright(+)]$ to select <FAX SETTINGS> \rightarrow press [Set].
- **3** Press [\triangleleft (-)] or [\triangleright (+)] to select <USER SETTINGS> \rightarrow press [Set].
- 4 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <TEL LINE SETTINGS> → press [Set].
- Press [◄(-)] or [►(+)] to select <UNIT TEL NUMBER> → press [Set].
- 6 Use the numeric keys to enter your fax/telephone number (max. 20 digits, including spaces) → press [Set].



To enter a plus sign (+) before the number, press [#].

To delete a previous number, press $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or [Clear]. To delete the entire entry, press and hold $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or [Clear].

- **7** Press [Menu].
- **8** Press [\blacktriangleleft (-)] or [\blacktriangleright (+)] to select <UNIT NAME> \rightarrow press [Set].
- 9 Use the numeric keys to enter your name (max. 24 characters, including spaces) → press [Set].



10 Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.

Setting the Telephone Line Type

Before using the machine, make sure you have set the correct telephone line type for your telephone line. If you are unsure of your telephone line type, contact your telephone company.



∅ NOTE

You can print the USER DATA LIST to check the current setting. (See "Printing the USER DATA LIST," on p. 6-9.)

- Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <FAX SETTINGS> → press [Set].
- Press $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or $[\blacktriangleright(+)]$ to select <USER SETTINGS> \rightarrow press [Set].
- Press $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or $[\blacktriangleright(+)]$ to select <TEL LINE SETTINGS> \rightarrow press [Set].
- **5** Press [**4**(-)] or [**▶**(+)] to select <TEL LINE TYPE> → press [Set].
- 6 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select the telephone line type → press [Set].

You can select from the following:

- <TOUCH TONE> for tone dialing
- < ROTARY PULSE> for pulse dialing
- Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.

Speed Dialing



This chapter explains how to simplify the dialing process by assigning the recipient names and their fax/telephone numbers to only one or two keys.

Speed Dialing Methods

Speed dialing allows you to dial fax/telephone numbers by simply pressing one or a few keys.

The following speed dialing methods are available:

■ One-Touch Speed Dialing

Register a fax/telephone number for one-touch speed dialing (see "Registering One-Touch Speed Dialing," on p. 3-2), then to dial the number, simply press the one-touch speed dialing key assigned to that number.

■ Coded Speed Dialing

Register a fax/telephone number for coded speed dialing (see "Registering Coded Speed Dialing," on p. 3-4), then to dial the number, simply press [Coded Dial] → enter the two-digit code assigned to that number.

■ Group Dialing

Register a group of fax/telephone numbers for group dialing (see "Registering Group Dialing," on p. 3-6), then to send a document to all numbers in that group, simply press the one-touch speed dialing key, or press [Coded Dial] → enter the two-digit code assigned to that group.



After you set up your speed dialing keys, we recommend that you occasionally print a list of all fax/telephone numbers registered in the machine, and store it for reference. (See "Printing Speed Dialing Lists," on p. 3-8.)

Registering One-Touch Speed Dialing

Before you can use one-touch speed dialing (see "One-Touch Speed Dialing," on p. 4-7), you need to register the recipients' fax/telephone numbers. You can register up to 19 one-touch speed dialing keys, which can include group dialing numbers.



∧ NOTE

- You can also register multiple fax/telephone numbers in each one-touch speed dialing key. (See "Registering Group Dialing," on p. 3-6.)
- Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <ADD. REGISTRATION> → press [Set].
- Press $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or $[\blacktriangleright(+)]$ to select <1-TOUCH SPD DIAL> \rightarrow press [Set].
- 4 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select a one-touch speed dialing key (01 to 19) → press [Set] twice.

You can also select a key by pressing the one-touch speed dialing key.

Use the numeric keys to enter the fax/telephone number you want to register (max. 120 digits, including spaces and pauses) → press [Set] twice.



6 Use the numeric keys to enter a name for the one-touch speed dialing key (max. 16 characters, including spaces) → press [Set].

To continue registering one-touch speed dialing keys, repeat the procedure from step

Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.



Use the destination labels provided with the machine to label the one-touch speed dialing keys with the recipients' names.

Changing or Deleting an Entry

■ Changing a Fax/Telephone Number You Registered

Follow steps 1 to 4 of "Registering One-Touch Speed Dialing" (see p. 3-2). In step 5, press and hold $[\P(-)]$ or [Clean] to delete an entire fax/telephone number \rightarrow use the numeric keys to enter a new number \rightarrow press [Set] \rightarrow [Stop/Reset].



You can also press [◄(-)] or [Clear] repeatedly to delete the registered number.

■ Changing a Name You Registered

Follow steps 1 to 5 of "Registering One-Touch Speed Dialing" (see p. 3-2). In step 6, press and hold [Clear] to delete an entire name → use the numeric keys to enter a new name → press [Set] → [Stop/Reset].



You can also press [Clear] repeatedly to delete the registered name.

■ Deleting an Entire Entry

Follow steps 1 to 4 of "Registering One-Touch Speed Dialing" (see p. 3-2). In step 5, press and hold $[\P(-)]$ or [Clean] to delete the registered number \rightarrow press $[Set] \rightarrow [Stop/Reset]$.



- When deleting the registered number, the registered name is cleared automatically.
- You can also press [◄(-)] or [Clear] repeatedly to delete the registered number.


Registering Coded Speed Dialing

Before you can use coded speed dialing (see "Coded Speed Dialing," on p. 4-7), you need to register the recipients' fax/telephone numbers. You can register up to 100 fax/telephone numbers.

- Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [\triangleleft (-)] or [\triangleright (+)] to select <ADD. REGISTRATION> \rightarrow press [Set].
- **3** Press [◄(-)] or [▶ (+)] to select <CODED SPD DIAL> → press [Set].
- 4 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select a coded speed dialing code (00 to 99) → press [Set] twice.

You can also select a code by pressing [Coded Dial] → entering the two-digit code with the numeric keys.

Use the numeric keys to enter the fax/telephone number you want to register (max. 120 digits, including spaces and pauses) → press [Set] twice.



6 Use the numeric keys to enter a name for the coded speed dialing code (max. 16 characters, including spaces) → press [Set].

To continue registering coded speed dialing codes, repeat the procedure from step 4.

7 Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.

Changing or Deleting an Entry

■ Changing a Fax/Telephone Number You Registered

Follow steps 1 to 4 of "Registering Coded Speed Dialing" (see p. 3-4). In step 5, press and hold $[\P(-)]$ or [Clear] to delete an entire fax/telephone number \rightarrow use the numeric keys to enter a new number \rightarrow press $[Set] \rightarrow [Stop/Reset]$.



You can also press [◄(-)] or [Clear] repeatedly to delete the registered number.

■ Changing a Name You Registered

Follow steps 1 to 5 of "Registering Coded Speed Dialing" (see p. 3-4). In step 6, press and hold $[\P(-)]$ or [Clear] to delete an entire name \rightarrow use the numeric keys to enter a new name \rightarrow press $[Set] \rightarrow [Stop/Reset]$.



You can also press [◄(-)] or [Clear] repeatedly to delete the registered name.

■ Deleting an Entire Entry

Follow steps 1 to 4 of "Registering Coded Speed Dialing" (see p. 3-4). In step 5, press and hold [\triangleleft (-)] or [Clear] to delete the registered number \rightarrow press [Set] \rightarrow [Stop/Reset].



- When deleting the registered number, the registered name is cleared automatically.
- You can also press [◄(-)] or [Clear] repeatedly to delete the registered number.

Registering Group Dialing

Before you can use group dialing (see "Group Dialing," on p. 4-7), you need to register the recipients' fax/telephone numbers. You can register up to 118 groups, which can include one-touch speed dialing keys and/or coded speed dialing codes. Each time you program a one-touch speed dialing key or coded speed dialing code, the amount of group dials available is reduced by one.



∅ NOTE

- You can only enter the fax/telephone numbers that have already been registered for one-touch or coded speed dialing. See the following titles:
 - "Registering One-Touch Speed Dialing," on p. 3-2
 - "Registering Coded Speed Dialing," on p. 3-4
- You cannot enter numbers with the numeric keys.
- Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [**4**(-)] or [**▶**(+)] to select <ADD. REGISTRATION> → press [Set].
- **3** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <GROUP DIAL> → press [Set].
- Specify an empty one-touch speed dialing key or coded speed dialing code that you want to set as the group dial.
 - To register a group under a one-touch speed dialing key:
 - \square Press [\blacktriangleleft (-)] or [\blacktriangleright (+)] to select a one-touch speed dialing key (01 to 19) \rightarrow press [Set] twice.

You can also select a key by pressing the one-touch speed dialing key.

- To register a group under a coded speed dialing code:
 - ☐ Press [Coded Dial] → use the numeric keys to enter the two-digit code (00 to 99) → press [Set] twice.

5 Select the speed dialing numbers you want to register in the group → press [Set] twice.

The speed dialing number refers to the one-touch dialing number or coded speed dialing number under which the fax/telephone number is programmed.

To enter in the group a number stored under a one-touch speed dialing key, press the desired one-touch speed dialing key(s).

To enter a number stored under a coded speed dialing code, press [Coded Dial] → enter the two-digit code for the number using the numeric keys. For multiple entries, press [Coded Dial] between each entry.



To review the numbers you have entered, press $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or $[\blacktriangleright(+)]$.

6 Use the numeric keys to enter a name for the group (max. 16 characters, including spaces) → press [Set].

NAME	:1		GROUP DIAL	
Canon group	2	→	[02] GROUP	DIAL

To continue registering other groups, repeat the procedure from step 4.

The name you enter here will appear in speed dialing lists.

Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.

Changing or Deleting an Entry

■ Deleting a Fax/Telephone Number from the Group

Follow steps 1 to 4 of "Registering Group Dialing" (see p. 3-6). In step 5, press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to display the number you want to delete → press [Clear] → press [Set] → [Stop/ Reset].

■ Adding a Fax/Telephone Number to the Group

Follow steps 1 to 4 of "Registering Group Dialing" (see p. 3-6). In step 5, simply enter the additional number as explained.

■ Deleting an Entire Group

Follow steps 1 to 4 of "Registering Group Dialing" (see p. 3-6). In step 5, press [Clear] repeatedly until all numbers are deleted → press [Set] → [Stop/Reset].



When deleting all numbers, the registered group name is cleared automatically.

Printing Speed Dialing Lists

You can print lists of the recipients registered for speed dialing. You may want to keep these lists near the machine to refer to them when dialing.


- 1 Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [\blacktriangleleft (-)] or [\blacktriangleright (+)] to select <REPORTS/LISTS> \rightarrow press [Set].
- **3** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <SPEED DIAL LIST> → press [Set].
- **4** Press [**◄**(-)] or [**▶** (+)] to select the list you want to print → press [Set].

You can select from the following:

- <1-TOUCH LIST>
- < CODED DIAL LIST>
- <GROUP DIAL LIST>



Sending Faxes

This chapter describes the different ways to send faxes. It also explains how to adjust scan settings to improve the image quality.

Sending Methods

There are two methods of sending faxes from the machine:

- Memory Sending
- Manual Sending



- You can also fax the documents from your computer. If you want to install the software for fax sending, see the following:
 - "To Use the Machine as a Local Printer (USB Connection)," or "To Use the Machine as a Network Printer (Network Connection)," in the Set-Up Instructions for Networking and Printing
 - Chapter 1, "Installation," in the Software Guide
- For details on how to send faxes from your computer, see Chapter 4, "PC Faxing," in the Software Guide.

Memory Sending

You should normally use memory sending to send documents efficiently. If <MEMORY FULL> is displayed, the machine cannot scan the documents. In this case, wait for the machine to send any faxes stored in the memory, then scan the documents.



You can register a new fax job while the machine is waiting to redial the recipient's number automatically. For details on how to set the machine to redial automatically, see "Automatic Redialing," on p. 4-9. You can store up to 20 fax jobs or approximately 256 pages in the memory.*

* Based on the condition that the other party sends the fax by the Color imageCLASS MF8170c with Canon Fax Standard Chart No. 1, standard mode. The maximum number of pages that the machine's memory can store differs depending on the other party's machine.

1 Place the document on the platen glass or load it in the ADF → press [FAX].

For details on the types of documents you can fax, their requirements, and how to place or load documents, see Chapter 3, "Document Handling," in the *Basic Guide*.

2 Adjust any necessary settings for your document.

- Press [Image Quality] to select the fax resolution. (See "Adjusting the Image Quality (Fax Resolution)," on p. 4-5.)
- Press [Exposure] to select the scan density. (See "Adjusting the Exposure (Scan Density)," on p. 4-5.)

3 Dial the recipient's fax/telephone number.

For details on the different dialing methods, see "Dialing Methods," on p. 4-6.

4 Press [B&W Start].

If you are using the ADF, the fax will be transmitted automatically.

If you are using the platen glass, you will be prompted when the page has been scanned. Place the next page (for a multipage document) → press [B&W Start]. To start sending, after all the pages have been scanned, press [Set].



To cancel memory sending, press [Stop/Reset].

You can also cancel sending using [Status Monitor]. (See Chapter 7, "System Monitor," in the *Basic Guide*.)

Manual Sending

Use manual sending when you want to talk to the recipient before sending a document, or if the recipient does not have a fax machine that can receive automatically.



- You will need to connect a telephone to the machine if you want to talk to the recipient before sending a document.
- You cannot use the platen glass for manual sending.

Connect a telephone to the machine if you want to talk to the recipient before sending a document.

For details on how to connect a telephone to the machine, see "Connect the telephone cable," in the Set-Up Instructions for the Machine.

2 Load the document in the ADF → press [FAX].

For details on the types of documents you can fax, their requirements, and how to load documents, see Chapter 3, "Document Handling," in the Basic Guide.

- 3 Adjust any necessary settings for your document.
 - Press [Image Quality] to select the fax resolution. (See "Adjusting the Image Quality") (Fax Resolution)," on p. 4-5.)
 - Press [Exposure] to select the scan density. (See "Adjusting the Exposure (Scan Density)," on p. 4-5.)
- Press [Hook] or pick up the handset of your telephone.
- 5 Dial the recipient's fax/telephone number.

For details on the different dialing methods, see "Dialing Methods," on p. 4-6.



You cannot use group dialing for manual sending.

6 Talk through the handset to the recipient.

If you press [Hook] in step 4, you can pick up the handset when you hear the recipient' voice.

If you hear a high-pitched signal instead of the recipient's voice, go to step 8.

Ask the recipient to set his fax machine to receive faxes.

8 When you hear a high-pitched signal, press [B&W Start] → hang up the handset.



- To cancel manual sending, press [Status Monitor]. (See Chapter 7, "System Monitor," in the Basic Guide.)
- If the offhook alarm starts beeping, make sure that the handset is resting properly on the handset cradle. The offhook alarm can be turned off. (See <4. OFFHOOK ALARM> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-3.)

Improving Faxed Images

There are several settings that allow you to improve the quality of faxed documents.

Adjusting the Image Quality (Fax Resolution)

You can adjust the image quality (fax resolution) of the document you send. The higher the image quality, the better the output quality at the other end, but the longer the transmission time. Adjust the image quality according to the type of document you are sending.

- 1 Press [Image Quality].
- **2** Press $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or $[\blacktriangleright(+)]$ to select the resolution \rightarrow press [Set].

You can select from the following:

- <STANDARD> for most text-only documents (203 x 98 dpi)
- <FINE> for fine-print documents (203 x 196 dpi)
- <PHOTO> for documents that contain photographs (203 x 196 dpi)
- <SUPER FINE> for documents that contain fine print and images (the resolution is four times that of <STANDARD>). (203 x 391 dpi)
- <ULTRA FINE> for documents that contain fine print and images (the resolution is eight times that of <STANDARD>). (406 x 391 dpi)

Adjusting the Exposure (Scan Density)

Density is the degree of differences between light and dark areas of an image.

- 1 Press [Exposure].
- 2 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to adjust the density → press [Set].



You can select from the following:

- Set in the middle for standard documents
- Press [▶(+)] for light documents to be darker
- Press [◄(-)] for dark documents to be lighter

Dialing Methods

There are several ways of dialing the fax/telephone number of the party to which you want to send a fax. They are as follows:

■ When the Fax/Telephone Number Is Not Registered in the Machine

- Regular Dialing
- Redialing

■ When the Fax/Telephone Number Is Registered in the Machine

- One-Touch Speed Dialing
- Coded Speed Dialing
- Group Dialing
- Directory Dialing



NOTE

- If you are unsure of the registered fax/telephone number, check the destination labels, or print each list and check the numbers. (See "Printing Speed Dialing Lists," on p. 3-8.)
- For details on registering a fax/telephone number for speed dialing, see Chapter 3, "Speed Dialing."
- The machine must be set to the Fax mode when dialing and your fax document must be loaded in the ADF or on the platen glass.

Regular Dialing

When you come to a step that requires dialing a number, you can dial the number with the keys on the numeric keypad, just like you would when dialing a telephone number.

Dial a fax/telephone number with the numeric keys.



If you enter a wrong number, press [◄(-)] or [Clear] to delete the last digit. Or press and hold [◄(-)] or [Clear] to delete all the digits you entered.

Press [B&W Start] to dial the number.

One-Touch Speed Dialing

1 Press the desired one-touch speed dialing key (01 to 19).

The number registered under that one-touch speed dialing key is displayed.

<NOT REGISTERED> appears if no fax/telephone number is assigned to the one-touch speed dialing key you pressed.



If you press a wrong key, press [Stop/Reset].

2 Press [B&W Start] to dial the number.

Coded Speed Dialing

1 Press [Coded Dial] → enter the desired two-digit code (00 to 99) with the numeric keys.

The number registered under that coded speed dialing code is displayed.

<NOT REGISTERED> appears if no fax/telephone number is assigned to the coded speed dialing code you entered.



If you enter a wrong code, press [Stop/Reset].

2 Press [B&W Start] to dial the number.

Group Dialing

Press the desired one-touch speed dialing key (01 to 19), or press [Coded Dial] → enter the two-digit code (00 to 99) to which a group of fax/telephone numbers are assigned.

The name of the group is displayed.

<NOT REGISTERED> appears if no fax/telephone number is assigned to the one-touch speed dialing key you pressed.



- If you press a wrong key, press [Stop/Reset].
- You cannot enter an unregistered fax/telephone number directly into a group.
- 2 Press [B&W Start] to dial the numbers.

Directory Dialing

Directory dialing allows you to look up the other party's name you registered and retrieve the number for dialling. This feature is convenient when you know the other party's name but cannot recall the one-touch speed dialling key, the code for coded speed dialling, or group dialling where the number is registered.

1 Press [Directory].

<NOT REGISTERED> appears if there are no numbers registered, and the display returns to dial entry mode.

2 Press a numeric key to enter the first letter of the name of the party you are searching for.

For example, if you want to search for a name that starts with the letter "H", press 4 (GHI) twice.

Entries starting with the letter you entered are displayed.

If there is no entry that starts with the letter you entered, entries that start with the next letter will be displayed.

3 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to display the other names.

Pressing [▶(+)] displays the names of other parties in alphabetical order.

Pressing [◄(-)] displays them in reverse order.

When you reach the last name, the display returns to the first name.

The other party's name, or the name for group dialing appear.

- 4 With the name you want to dial displayed, press [Set].
- 5 Press [B&W Start] to dial the number(s).

Rediating a Busy Number

There are two methods of redialing:

- Manual Redialing
- Automatic Redialing

Manual Redialing

Press [Redial/Pause] to redial the last number entered with the numeric keys.



∧ NOTE

- To cancel manual redialing, press [Stop/Reset].
- The last number entered with the numeric keys will be deleted when you unplug and plug the power cord.

Automatic Redialing

When using memory sending to send a document and the recipient's line is busy, the machine will redial the number after an interval.

The machine allows you to customize automatic redialing settings to suit your needs. (See "Customizing Automatic Redialing Settings" below.)



∅ NOTE

To cancel automatic redialing, wait until the machine starts redialing → press [Stop/ Reset] → follow the instructions in the LCD.

You can also cancel automatic redialing using [Status Monitor]. (See Chapter 7, "System Monitor," in the Basic Guide.)

■ Customizing Automatic Redialing Settings

You can customize the following settings:

- Whether or not the machine redials automatically
- The number of times the machine redials
- The time interval between redialings

- 1 Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <FAX SETTINGS> → press [Set].
- 3 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <TX SETTINGS> → press [Set].
- 4 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <AUTO REDIAL> → press [Set].
- Press [◄(-)] or [►(+)] to select <ON> to enable automatic redialing or <OFF> to disable it.
 - If you selected <OFF>:
 - ☐ Press [Set].
 - If you selected <ON>:
 - ☐ Press [Set] twice.
 - □ Press [◄(-)] or [►(+)], or use the numeric keys to enter the number of times you want the machine to redial → press [Set] twice.

You can set the machine to redial between 1 to 10 times.

REDIAL TIMES
$$\rightarrow$$
 REDIAL INTERVAL $_{2MIN}$.

□ Press [◄(-)] or [►(+)], or use the numeric keys to enter the time interval between redialings → press [Set].

You can set the time interval between 2 to 99 minutes.



6 Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.

Sending the Same Document to Several Recipients Sequential Broadcasting)

The machine allows you to send the same document to a maximum of 100 recipients in one operation.



∅ NOTE

If you frequently send documents to the same group of recipients, you can group these numbers for group dialing. This will allow you to send documents to all recipients in the group at the press of one or a few keys.

Place the document on the platen glass or load it in the ADF → press [FAX].

For details on how to place or load documents, see Chapter 3, "Document Handling," in the Basic Guide.

2 Adjust any necessary settings for your document.

- Press [Image Quality] to select the fax resolution. (See "Adjusting the Image Quality (Fax Resolution)," on p. 4-5.)
- Press [Exposure] to select the scan density. (See "Adjusting the Exposure (Scan Density)," on p. 4-5.)

3 Enter the fax/telephone numbers you want to send to.

To use one-touch speed dialing:

☐ Press the one-touch speed dialing key(s). You can dial up to 19 destinations.

To use coded speed dialing:

☐ Press [Coded Dial] → use the numeric keys to enter the two-digit code. You can dial up to 100 destinations.



Repeat the step above to enter the other codes if necessary.

To use regular dialing:

Use the numeric keys to enter the fax/telephone number → press [Set]. You can dial up to one destination.

Press [Redial/Pause] to redial the last number dialed with the numeric keys.

To use directory dialing:

- ☐ Press [Directory].
- ☐ Press a numeric key which contains the first letter of the desired destination.
- ☐ Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to scroll through the required names until you find the desired destination → press [Set].



- After entering the first one-touch speed dialing key or coded speed dialing code, you have 5 seconds to enter another speed dialing key or code before the machine begins sending automatically. If you have entered more than one speed dialing button or code, the machine waits for 10 seconds before it begins sending. If you do not want the machine to send automatically, you need to change <TIME OUT> in <TX SETTINGS> in <FAX SETTINGS> of the Menu. (See <4. TIME OUT> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-4.)
- To review the numbers you have entered, press [◄(-)] or [►(+)].

After you have specified all of the destinations, press [B&W Start].

If you are using the platen glass, you will be prompted when the page has been scanned. Place the next page (for a multipage document) → press [B&W Start]. To start sending, press [Set].



∧ NOTE

- Regardless of the order you used when dialing, the machine sends the document to the destinations you specified in this order: regular dialing numbers, one-touch speed dialing numbers, then coded speed dialing numbers.
- Only one broadcasting job will be active at any given time.
- To cancel sending, press [Stop/Reset] → follow the instructions in the LCD. When you press [Stop/Reset], sending to all recipients will be canceled. You cannot cancel sending to only one recipient. (See Chapter 7, "System Monitor," in the Basic Guide.)

Special Dialing

This section explains special dialing features, such as dialing an overseas number, and switching temporarily to tone dialing.

Dialing an Overseas Number (With Pauses)

When you dial or register an overseas number, you may need to insert a pause within the number.



You cannot insert a pause after the last number you entered for manual sending.

Place the document on the platen glass or load it in the ADF → press [FAX].

For details on the types of documents you can fax, their requirements, and how to place or load documents, see Chapter 3, "Document Handling," in the Basic Guide.

- **2** Adjust any necessary settings for your document.
 - Press [Image Quality] to select the fax resolution. (See "Adjusting the Image Quality (Fax Resolution)," on p. 4-5.)
 - Press [Exposure] to select the scan density. (See "Adjusting the Exposure (Scan Density)," on p. 4-5.)
- **3** Use the numeric keys to dial the international access code.

For details on international access codes, contact your local telephone company.



If you enter a wrong number, press [4(-)] or [Clear] to delete the last digit. Or press and hold [◄(-)] or [Clear] to delete all the digits you entered.

If necessary, press [Redial/Pause] to enter a two-second pause (P).

TEL = 0P		
T.E.T = 0 b		
l		
l		

For a longer pause, press [Redial/Pause] again for another two-second pause. Alternatively, you can change the length of the pause. (See <2. PAUSE TIME> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-4.)

5 Use the numeric keys to dial the country code, the area code, and the fax/telephone number of the other party.



- If you enter a wrong number, press [Stop/Reset] → start again from step 3.
- If you make a mistake, press [◄(-)] or [Clear] to delete the last digit. Or press and hold [◄(-)] or [Clear] to delete all the digits you entered.

Press [B&W Start].



🥟 NOTE

- To cancel sending after dialing has started, press [Stop/Reset] → follow the instructions in the LCD.
- To take advantage of the speed dialing features of the machine, register frequently used overseas numbers for one-touch or coded speed dialing. (See Chapter 3, "Speed Dialing.")

Switching Temporarily to Tone Dialing

Many banks, airline, and hotels provide automated information services that require tone dialing. If the machine is connected to a rotary pulse line, follow this procedure to set the machine temporarily for tone dialing:

- Press [FAX].
- **2** Press [Hook] or pick up the handset of your telephone.



NOTE

When using your telephone, you need to connect it to the machine. (See "Connect the telephone cable," in the Set-Up Instructions for the Machine.)

Enter a destination using the numeric keys on your telephone or using a one-touch speed dialing key, coded speed dialing code, [Redial/Pause], or the numeric keys on the machine.

4 When the recorded message of the information service answers, press [*] to switch to tone dialing.

When [*] is pressed, <T> is displayed in the LCD.

If your telephone line uses tone dialing, go to the next step.

5 Use the numeric keys on the machine to enter the numbers requested by the information service.

Numbers entered after pressing [*] will be dialed using tone dialing.

- 6 If you want to receive faxes, press [B&W Start].
- **7** Press [Hook] or hang up the handset to disconnect the call.

Tone dialing is canceled when you disconnect the call.



If the offhook alarm starts beeping, make sure that the handset is resting properly on the handset cradle. The offhook alarm can be turned off. (See <4. OFFHOOK ALARM> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-3.)

Receiving Faxes



This chapter describes the different ways to receive faxes. It also explains how to set the receive mode and to cancel the documents the machine is receiving.

Setting the Receive Mode

Follow this procedure to set the receive mode:

- 1 Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [\blacktriangleleft (-)] or [\blacktriangleright (+)] to select <FAX SETTINGS> \rightarrow press [Set].
- **3** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <RECEIVE MODE> → press [Set].
- **4** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select the receive mode → press [Set].

You can select from the following:

- <FaxOnly> to automatically receive faxes only. Voice calls will be disconnected. (See "Receiving Faxes Automatically: FaxOnly Mode," on p. 5-2.)
- <FaxTel> to automatically switch between fax and voice calls. Faxes will be received automatically, and the machine will ring for voice calls. (See "Receiving Both Faxes and Voice Calls Automatically: FaxTel Mode," on p. 5-3.)
- <AnsMode> to receive faxes automatically and route voice calls to an answering machine connected to the machine. (See "Receiving When an Answering Machine Is Connected: AnsMode," on p. 5-4.)

- <DRPD> to distinguish between fax and voice calls by using Distinctive Ring Pattern Detection. (See "Receiving with a DRPD (Distinctive Ring Pattern Detection) Service: DRPD," on p. 5-5.)
- <Manual> for the connected telephone to ring for fax and voice calls. Fax calls must be answered manually. (See "Receiving Faxes Manually: Manual Mode," on p. 5-7.)



If you set <5. MAN/AUTO SWITCH> to <0N> in <FAX SETTINGS> of the Menu, the machine will receive faxes automatically even when the receive mode is set to <Manual>. (See <5. MAN/AUTO SWITCH> of "Menu Descriptions." on p. 8-5.)

5 Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.



You can save the toner consumption when printing out the received documents. (See Chapter 10, "Machine Settings," in the *Basic Guide*.)

Receiving Faxes Automatically: FaxOnly Mode

If you want to select <FaxOnly>, check the following:

■ Select This Mode If:

- you have a dedicated telephone line for fax use only.
- you only want to receive faxes automatically with the machine.

■ You Will Need to:

set <FaxOnly>. (See "Setting the Receive Mode," on p. 5-1.)

■ When You Receive a Fax Call

The machine will receive the fax automatically.

■ When You Receive a Voice Call

You will not be able to answer the call.



- If you connect a telephone to the machine and enable the <INCOMING RING> setting, the telephone will ring when the machine receives a voice call, and then you can answer the call.
- You can select the number of rings. (See <4. INCOMING RING> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-5.)

Receiving Both Faxes and Voice Calls Automatically: FaxTel Mode

■ Select This Mode If:

- you only have one telephone line for both fax and telephone use.
- you want to receive faxes automatically as well as voice calls.
- You Will Need to:

set <FaxTel>. (See "Setting the Receive Mode," on p. 5-1.)

■ When You Receive a Fax Call

The machine will receive the fax automatically.

■ When You Receive a Voice Call

The machine will ring. Pick up the handset to answer the call.

Customizing FaxTel

You can customize this mode to control precisely how your machine handles incoming calls. You can adjust the time the machine takes to check whether a call is a fax or voice call, the length of time the machine rings when it is a voice call, and the action the machine must take if no one answers a voice call.

Follow this procedure to customize <FaxTel>:



∅ NOTE

We recommend you leave these settings on the default settings unless you have a particular need to change them. Certain settings can affect your ability to receive faxes.

- Press [Menu].
- **2** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <FAX SETTINGS> → press [Set].
- Press [\triangleleft (-)] or [\triangleright (+)] to select <RX SETTINGS> \rightarrow press [Set].

- 4 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <FAX/TEL OPT. SET> → press [Set] twice.
- Press [◄(-)] or [▶ (+)] to select the time 0 to 30 seconds that the machine takes to check whether a call is fax or voice call → press [Set] twice.
- **6** Press [◄(-)] or [▶ (+)] to select the length of time 15 to 30 seconds that the machine rings when the call is a voice call → press [Set] twice.
- **7** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select whether the machine switches to receive mode or disconnects the call if no one answers a voice call after the specified time in step 6 → press [Set].

You can select from the following:

- <RECEIVE> to switch to receive mode
- <DISCONNECT> to disconnect the call
- 8 Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.

Receiving When an Answering Machine Is Connected: AnsMode

If you want to select <AnsMode>, check the following:

■ Select This Mode If:

- you only have one telephone line for both fax and telephone use.
- you want to receive faxes automatically and receive voice messages on your answering machine.

■ You Will Need to:

set <AnsMode>. (See "Setting the Receive Mode," on p. 5-1.)



Follow the guidelines below to adjust the answering machine:

- Set the answering machine to answer on the first or second ring.
- The entire message should be no longer than 15 seconds.
- In the message, tell your callers how to send a fax.

■ When You Receive a Fax Call

The machine will receive the fax automatically.

■ When You Receive a Voice Call

The answering machine will record any voice messages.

Receiving with a DRPD (Distinctive Ring Pattern **Detection) Service: DRPD**

If you want to select <DRPD>, check the following:

■ Select This Mode If:

- you only have one telephone line for both fax and telephone use.
- you want to receive faxes automatically as well as voice calls.
- you have subscribed to a DRPD (Distinctive Ring Pattern Detection) service with your telephone company. This service assigns two or more fax/telephone numbers with distinctive ring patterns to a single telephone line, allowing you to have both a fax number(s) and a telephone number(s) using only one telephone line. The machine will automatically monitor incoming calls and based on the ring pattern, will let you know if the call is a fax or voice call. Contact your telephone company for more information on this service.

■ You Will Need to:

set <DRPD>. (See "Setting the Receive Mode," on p. 5-1.)

■ When You Receive a Fax Call

The telephone will ring according to the ring pattern you have chosen and the machine receives the fax automatically.

■ When You Receive a Voice Call

The telephone will ring according to the ring pattern you have chosen. Pick up the handset to answer the call.

Setting the Ring Pattern

Your telephone company will assign a distinctive ring pattern to each number when you order the DRPD service. Follow this procedure to set the fax ring pattern that matches the pattern assigned by the telephone company:

- Make sure you have set the receive mode to <DRPD>. (See "Setting the Receive Mode," on p. 5-1.)
- 2 Press [Menu].
- **3** Press [\triangleleft (-)] or [\triangleright (+)] to select <FAX SETTINGS> \rightarrow press [Set].
- **4** Press [**4**(-)] or [**▶**(+)] to select <RX SETTINGS> → press [Set].
- **5** Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <DRPD:SELECT FAX> → press [Set].
- **6** Press [◄(-)] or [▶ (+)] to select a ring pattern → press [Set].

- You can select from the following:
- < NORMAL RING>
- <DOUBLE RING>

- Press [Stop/Reset] to return to the standby display.

Receiving Faxes Manually: Manual Mode

If you want to select <Manual>, check the following:

■ Select This Mode If:

- you only have one telephone line for both fax and telephone use.
- you receive mainly voice calls and sometimes faxes.

■ You Will Need to:

- set <Manual>. (See "Setting the Receive Mode," on p. 5-1.)
- make sure the <REMOTE RX> setting in the <RX SETTINGS> menu is enabled, if you want to start receiving a document from the telephone. (See <6. REMOTE RX> of "Menu Descriptions," p. 8-5.)

■ When You Receive a Fax Call

The telephone will ring. Pick up the handset and if you hear a beep → press [B&W Start] on the machine to receive the fax, or enter the two-digit ID code from the telephone → hang up the handset.



If the offhook alarm starts beeping, make sure that the handset is resting properly on the handset cradle. The offhook alarm can be turned off. (See <4. OFFHOOK ALARM> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-3.)

■ When You Receive a Voice Call

The telephone will ring. Pick up the handset to answer the call. If the caller wants to send a document after talking to you, ask them to press the start key on their fax machine. When you hear a beep, press [B&W Start] on the machine to receive the fax → hang up the handset.



The telephone rings for every call, whether it is a fax call or a voice call. If you want the machine to receive faxes automatically after ringing for a specified number of rings, enable the <MAN/AUTO SWITCH> setting. You can also specify the number of rings before the machine receives faxes. (See <5. MAN/AUTO SWITCH> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-5.)

Receiving Faxes While Performing Other Tasks

Since the machine is a multitasking device, it can receive faxes and voice calls while you are performing other tasks.

- If you receive a fax while you are performing certain tasks, the machine stores the incoming fax in the memory. Then, as soon as you finish your task, the machine automatically prints the fax. You can receive a fax while performing the following tasks:
 - Printing
 - Scanning (Scan mode)*
- Scanning to send a fax
- Printing reports or lists
- Copying
- * Starts printing the fax as soon as the machine receives it, while performing this task.
- You cannot receive a fax while sending a fax.

Receiving Faxes in the Memory When a Problem **Occurs**

If the machine encounters a problem when it is receiving a fax, the machine automatically stores the unprinted pages of the fax in the memory, and the LCD displays <RECEIVED IN MEMORY> as well as one or more messages. When the problem is cleared, the machine automatically prints the fax which was stored in the memory. For an explanation of the message(s) and details on the action to take, see "LCD Messages," on p. 7-1.



- The machine memory can store up to 20 fax jobs or approximately 256 pages.*
 - * Based on the condition that the other party sends the fax by the Color imageCLASS MF8170c with Canon Fax Standard Chart No. 1, standard mode. The maximum number of pages that the machine's memory can store differs depending on the other party's machine.
- Once the pages are printed, they are deleted from the memory.
- If the memory becomes full, you will not be able to receive the remaining pages. Contact the other party and ask them to resend the remaining pages of the fax.

Canceling Receiving

Follow this procedure if you want to stop receiving a fax before reception is completed:

Press [Stop/Reset].

The confirmation message will appear.

CANCEL DURING TX/RX? < YES NO >

2 Press [◄(-)] to cancel receiving.

If you change your mind and want to continue receiving, press $[\downarrow (+)]$ for < NO >.


- The paper sizes that can be used for reports and lists function are letter, legal and A4. Only papers loaded in the cassette can be used for reports and lists function.
- You can cancel printing the reports or lists using [Status Monitor]. (See Chapter 7, "System Monitor," in the Basic Guide.)

ACTIVITY REPORT

Printing the ACTIVITY REPORT

By default, the machine is set to print an ACTIVITY REPORT after every 20 transactions.

Transactions in an ACTIVITY REPORT are listed chronologically.





The recipient's fax/telephone number (DESTINATION TEL/ID) is not shown for the manually sent faxes.

If you want to print an ACTIVITY REPORT manually, follow this procedure:

- 1 Press [Menu].
- 2 Press [◄(-)] or [▶(+)] to select <REPORTS/LISTS> → press [Set] twice.




Adjusting the TX REPORT Setting

The machine can print a TX (transmission) report (TX REPORT or ERROR TX REPORT) after sending a document. You can set it to print every time it sends a document, or only when an error occurs. 

Adjusting the RX REPORT Setting



Troubleshooting



This chapter describes the problems you might encounter during fax operations and their remedies. It also explains what to do if you cannot solve the problem by yourself.

LCD Messages

The following messages are displayed in the LCD when the machine performs a function or if it encounters an error.

This section describes messages related to fax functions. For other messages, see Chapter 9, "Troubleshooting," in the *Basic Guide*.

CHANGE PAPERSIZE

Cause When the machine prints the reports or lists, the paper size setting is set to a size other than <LTR>, <LGL> or <A4>.

Remedy Set the paper size setting to <LTR>, <LGL> or <A4> and load paper of the same size. For the TX report or RX report, the machine automatically prints the reports or lists which was stored in the memory.

CHECK DOCUMENT

Cause 1 There is a paper jam in the ADF.

Remedy Remove the document you are trying to send in the ADF. (See Chapter 9, "Troubleshooting," in the *Basic Guide*.)

Make sure that the document is not too long or too short. (See Chapter 3, "Document Handling," in the *Basic Guide*.)

Then reset the machine by opening the cartridge cover and then closing it.

Cause 2 The ADF roller rotates without feeding documents.

Remedy Fan the edge that will feed into the machine first, then tap the edge of multiple page documents on a flat surface to even the stack.

CHECK PAPER SIZE

Cause The size of the paper in the cassette or multi-purpose feeder is different from that of the paper specified in <PAPER SIZE> in <PAPER SETTINGS> of the Menu.

Remedy 1 Load the correct paper size or change <PAPER SIZE> in <PAPER SETTINGS> of the Menu. For more information, see the following:

- Chapter 2, "Paper Handling," in the Basic Guide
- Chapter 5, "Copying," in the Basic Guide Then reset the machine by opening the cartridge cover and then closing it.
- Remedy 2 If you are trying to print a report or list, set the paper size setting to <LTR>, <LGL> or <A4> and load paper of the same size. Then reset the machine by opening the cartridge cover and then closing it. The report or list will then be printed automatically.

DOCUMENT TOO LONG

Cause The document is longer than 1 m, or is not feeding correctly.

Remedy Reduce the length of the document to within 1 m, and then re-send it.

MEM IN USE nn %

Cause Shows the percentage of the memory currently in use. This message is displayed when you set the document in ADF.

Remedy If you need more space, wait for the machine to send any faxes in memory. Also print or delete any documents in memory you no longer needed.

MEMORY FULL

Cause 1 The memory becomes full during sending, or receiving the fax.

Remedy When sending the document, divide it into a few parts or select a lower fax resolution.

> If you need more space, wait for the machine to send any remaining faxes. If <MEMORY FULL> appears while scanning documents using the ADF, the document being scanned stops in the ADF. In this case, clear the paper jam in the ADF. (See Chapter 9, "Troubleshooting," in the Basic Guide.)

Cause 2 The number of fax jobs can be stored in memory reached the maximum.

Remedy The machine can store up to 20 fax jobs for each sending and receiving job, or 25 fax jobs including sending and receiving jobs. Wait for the machine to send any faxes in memory. Also print or delete any documents in memory.

NOT REGISTERED

The one-touch speed dialing key or coded speed dialing code you entered is not Cause registered.

Remedy Register the one-touch speed dialing key or coded speed dialing code. For more information, see the following:

- "Registering One-Touch Speed Dialing," on p. 3-2
- "Registering Coded Speed Dialing," on p. 3-4

RECEIVED IN MEMORY

Cause The machine received the fax in the memory because paper or toner ran out, a paper jam occurred, or incorrect paper size was loaded.

Remedy Load correct paper size in the cassette, replace the cartridge, or clear the paper jam. For more information, see the following:

- Chapter 2, "Paper Handling," in the Basic Guide
- Chapter 8, "Maintenance," in the Basic Guide
- Chapter 9, "Troubleshooting," in the Basic Guide

Error Codes

Errors in reports are recorded as error code numbers because there is not enough space to print a detailed description of the error in the report. When errors are recorded in reports, note the error code number, and check it against the table below to learn more about what caused the error and how to remedy it.

#0003	
Cause 1	The other party's fax machine did not respond within 55 seconds.
Remedy	Send the document again. Contact the other party and have them check their fax machine. You can try to send the document manually. If you are making an overseas call, add pauses to the registered number.
Cause 2	The other party is not using a G3 fax machine.
Remedy	Check with the other party, and send the document to a G3 fax machine. If the other party does not have a G3 fax machine, try sending your document using a transmission mode or speed that the other party supports. (See <3. TX START SPEED> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-3.)
#0012	
Cause	The other fax machine has run out of paper and its memory is full.
Remedy	Contact the other party, and tell them to refill their paper cassette.
#0018	
Cause	The other fax machine does not answer even after several redialing attempts, or the other fax machine is busy and did not respond within 55 seconds.
Remedy	Wait a few minutes and try sending again. If you still cannot send the document, contact the other party and confirm that the other fax machine has been turned on. If the other fax machine is busy, try sending your document at a later time.

Faxing Problems

Sending Problems

You cannot	You cannot send a fax.		
Q	Is the machine overheated?		
Α	Unplug the machine and let it cool about 5 minutes. Then plug in the machine and try sending again.		
Q	Did you connect the power cord to the machine just now?		
Α	Wait for a while. After connecting the power cord, the machine cannot scan documents immediately.		
Q	Is the machine set for the correct telephone line type (pulse/tone)?		
Α	Make sure the machine is set for the correct telephone line type. (See "Setting the Telephone Line Type," on p. 2-6.)		
Q	Is the document loaded?		
А	Remove the document, stack it if necessary, and place it on the platen glass or load it in the ADF correctly. For more information, see Chapter 3, "Document Handling," in the <i>Basic Guide</i> .		
Q	Is the one-touch speed dialing key or coded speed dialing code you entered registered for the feature you want to use?		
Α	Check the one-touch speed dialing key or coded speed dialing code and make sure it is registered correctly. (See Chapter 3, "Speed Dialing.")		
Q	Did you dial a correct number? Or have you been provided with an incorrect number?		
Α	Dial the number again, or check that you have the correct number.		
Q	Is the energy saver mode off?		
Α	The machine does not scan documents, if it is in the energy saver mode. To restore the machine from the energy saver mode, press [Energy Saver].		

- Does the other party's fax machine have enough paper?
- Call the other party and ask them to make sure paper is loaded in their fax machine.
- Did an error occur during sending?
- Print an ACTIVITY REPORT and check for an error. (See "Printing the ACTIVITY REPORT," on p. 6-3.)
- Is the telephone line working properly?
 - Α Make sure there is a dial tone when you pick up the handset of the telephone connected to the machine. If there is no dial tone, contact your local telephone company.
- Q Is the receiving fax machine a G3 fax machine?
- Α Make sure the receiving fax machine is compatible with the machine (which is a G3 fax machine).
- Q The other party's telephone may be busy or the other party's fax machine may be turned off. Is BUSY/NO SIGNAL shown on the ERROR TX REPORT?
- The fax/telephone number you dialed is busy. Try sending the document later.
- Α The other party's fax machine is not working. Contact the other party and have them check their fax machine.
- Did the receiving fax machine answer within 55 seconds (after all automatic redialing attempts)?
- Α Contact the other party and have them check their fax machine. For an overseas call, add pauses to the registered number. (See "Dialing an Overseas Number (With Pauses)," on p. 4-13.)
- Q Is the In Use/Memory indicator lighting?
- Α The In Use/Memory indicator may light, which means the extension phone is busy. Please wait until the extension phone becomes free.

Faxes sent from the machine are spotted or dirty.

- Is the sending fax machine working properly?
- Α Check the machine by making a copy. For more information, see Chapter 5, "Copying," in the Basic Guide.

If the copy is clear, the problem may be in the receiving fax machine. If the copy is spotted or dirty, clean the platen glass or the read area of the platen glass. For more information, see Chapter 8, "Maintenance," in the Basic Guide.

- Q Is the document loaded?
- A Remove the document, stack it if necessary, and place it on the platen glass or load it in the ADF correctly. For more information, see Chapter 3, "Document Handling," in the *Basic Guide*.

Cannot send using ECM (Error Correction Mode).

- Q Does the receiving fax machine support ECM?
- A If the receiving fax machine does not support ECM, the document is sent in the normal mode without error checking.

Errors occur frequently while sending.

- Q Are the telephone lines in proper condition? Or do you have a good connection?
- A Lower the transmission speed. (See <3. TX START SPEED> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-3.)

Receiving Problems

Cannot receive a fax automatically.

- Q Is the machine set to receive automatically?
- A For the machine to receive faxes automatically, the receive mode must be set to <FaxOnly>, <FaxTel>, <AnsMode>, or <DRPD>. (See Chapter 5, "Receiving Faxes.") If you have set <AnsMode>, confirm that an answering machine is connected to the machine and that it is turned on with an outgoing message properly recorded.

If you set <5. MAN/AUTO SWITCH> to <ON> in <FAX SETTINGS> of the Menu, the machine will receive faxes automatically even when the receive mode is set to <Manual>. (See <5. MAN/AUTO SWITCH> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-5.)

- Q Is the machine's memory full?
- A Wait for the machine to finish any fax or print jobs stored in the memory. Then ask the other party to resend the fax.
 - Q Did an error occur during reception?
- A Print an ACTIVITY REPORT and check for an error. (See "Printing the ACTIVITY REPORT," on p. 6-3.) You can also check the RX REPORT when it is printed automatically. (See "Adjusting the RX REPORT Setting," on p. 6-7.)

- Is the telephone line connected properly?
- Make sure all line connections are secure. (See "Connect the telephone cable," in the Set-Up Instructions for the Machine.)

The machine does not switch automatically between telephone and fax receptions.

- Q Is the machine set to switch automatically between telephone and fax receptions?
- Α For the machine to switch automatically, the receive mode must be set to <AnsMode>. (See Chapter 5, "Receiving Faxes.") Confirm that an answering machine is connected to the machine and that it is turned on with an outgoing message properly recorded.
- Is the sending fax machine able to send the CNG signal that tells the machine that the incoming signal is a fax?
- Α Some fax machines cannot send the CNG signal that tells the machine the incoming call is a fax. In such cases, you will have to receive the fax manually. (See "Receiving Faxes Manually: Manual Mode," on p. 5-7.)

Cannot receive a document manually.

- Is the machine set to receive manually?
- For the machine to receive faxes manually, the receive mode must be set to <Manual>. (See Chapter 5, "Receiving Faxes.")
- Did you press [B&W Start], or dial the remote receiving ID after hanging up the handset?
- Α Always press [B&W Start], or dial the remote receiving ID before hanging up the handset. Otherwise you will disconnect the call.

Print quality is poor.

- Are you using the correct type of paper?
- Α Make sure you load paper that meets the paper requirements for the machine. For more information, see Chapter 5, "Copying," in the Basic Guide.
- Is the sending fax machine functioning properly?
- The sending fax machine usually determines the fax's quality. Call the sender Α and have them make sure the scanning glass of their fax machine is clean.

- Is there <PREPARE NEW* CART> or <REPLACE* CARTRIDGE> message in the LCD?
- Α Replace the toner cartridge. * Indicates either "C", "M", "Y", or "K".
- Is the machine in the toner saver mode? Q
- Α Set <B & W TONER SAVER> to <OFF> in <COMMON SETTINGS> of the Menu. (See Chapter 10, "Machine Settings," in the Basic Guide.)

Faxes do not print.

- Q Is the cartridge installed properly?
- Α Make sure the cartridge is installed properly. For more information, see Chapter 8, "Maintenance," in the Basic Guide.
 - Q Is the sealing tape removed from the cartridge?
- Α Remove the sealing tape from the cartridge. (See "Install the toner cartridges," in the Set-Up Instructions for the Machine.)
 - Q Is any toner left in the cartridge?
 - Α Replace the cartridge with a new one. For more information, see Chapter 8, "Maintenance." in the Basic Guide.
- Α Select <KEEP PRINTING> in <PREPARE NEW* CART> in <RX SETTINGS> in <FAX SETTINGS> of the Menu. With this setting, the machine will not store documents in the memory even if the toner has run out. (See <8. TONER SUPPLY LOW> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-6.) * Indicates either "C", "M", "Y", or "K".
- Q Is the correct paper loaded in the cassette?
- Α Make sure paper is loaded in the cassette. For more information, see Chapter 2, "Paper Handling," in the Basic Guide.
- Α Load the correct paper size or change <PAPER SIZE> in <PAPER SETTINGS> of the Menu. For more information, see the following:
 - Chapter 2, "Paper Handling," in the Basic Guide
 - Chapter 5, "Copying," in the Basic Guide

Faxed images are blotched or uneven.

- Are the telephone lines in proper condition? Or do you have a good connection?
- Α ECM (Error Correction Mode) for sending/receiving should eliminate such problems. However, if the telephone lines are in poor condition, you may have to try again. Call the sender to resend the document.
- Q Is the sending fax machine functioning properly?
- Α The sending fax machine usually determines the fax's quality. Call the sender and have them make sure the scanning glass of their fax machine is clean.

Cannot receive a fax using ECM (Error Correction Mode).

- Does the sending fax machine support ECM?
- Α If the sending fax machine does not support ECM, the document is received in the normal mode without error checking.

Errors occur frequently while receiving.

- Are the telephone lines in proper condition? Or do you have a good connection?
- Α Lower the reception speed. (See <4. RX START SPEED> of "Menu Descriptions," on p. 8-3.)
- Q Is the sending fax machine functioning properly?
 - Call the sender and have them check that their fax machine is functioning properly.

Telephone Problems

You cannot dial.

- Is the telephone line connected properly?
- Α Make sure all line connections are secure. (See "Connect the telephone cable," in the Set-Up Instructions for the Machine.)
- Is the machine set for the correct telephone line type (pulse/tone)?
- Α Make sure the machine is set for the correct telephone line type. (See "Setting the Telephone Line Type," on p. 2-6.)

The telephone disconnects while you are talking.

- Is the telephone line connected in securely?
- Α Check that the telephone cables are connected securely to the jacks on the machine, the telephone jack on your wall and the jack on your telephone. (See "Connect the telephone cable," in the Set-Up Instructions for the Machine.)

If a Power Outage Occurs

If power is suddenly lost due to an outage or accidental unplugging, a built-in battery retains the user data settings and the speed dialing settings. Any sent or received documents stored in the memory are backed up for about 3 minutes.

During a power cut, functions are limited as follows:

- You cannot send, receive, copy, scan, or print documents.
- You may not be able to make telephone calls using a telephone connected to the machine, depending on the type of telephone you use.
- You can receive telephone calls using a telephone connected to the machine, depending on the type of telephone you use.

Press $[\blacktriangleleft(-)]$ or $[\blacktriangleright(+)]$ to select the sub menu you want to change \rightarrow press [Set].
