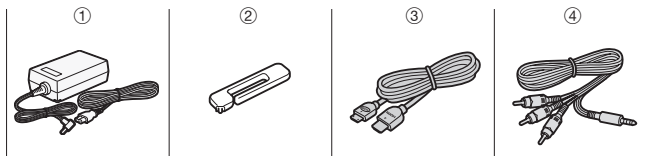



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About the Camcorder's PDF Instruction Manual

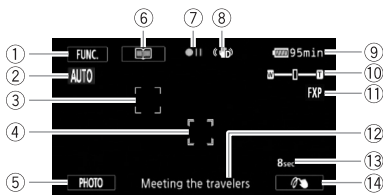
Installing the camcorder's Instruction Manual (PDF file)

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Insert the LEGRIA CD-ROM into the computer's disc drive.
- 3 **Windows:** Open the drive into which you inserted the CD-ROM using Windows Explorer.
Mac OS: Use Finder and click the CD-ROM icon.
- 4 Click/Double-click the **Disc_Setup** icon .
- 5 In the installer panel, click [Instruction Manual of the Camcorder] and select your language.
- 6 When the installation is complete, click [OK], then [Exit].

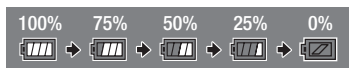

step 1

Charging the Battery Pack

The camcorder can be powered with a battery pack or directly using the compact power adapter. When you use the compact power adapter, the power of the battery pack will not be consumed. Charge the battery pack before use.



1 Connect the compact power adapter.

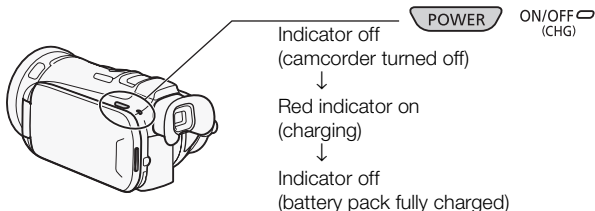
- ① Connect to the adapter.
- ② Plug into a power outlet.

2 Connect the camcorder. Plug into the DC IN terminal.

3 Insert the battery pack.

- ① Press softly into the battery attachment unit.
- ② Slide forward until it clicks in place.

Charging will start when the camcorder is turned off.



Charging times

Charging the supplied BP-808 Battery Pack will take approximately 2 hours 30 minutes. A fully charged battery pack will allow for the following operations (movies in FXP mode).

	Typical recording	Playback
Memory card	1 hr. 5 min.	2 hr. 30 min.
Built-in memory	1 hr. 5 min.	2 hr. 35 min.

All given times are approximate and vary according to recording mode and charging, recording or playback conditions.

IMPORTANT

- Do not connect to the camcorder's DC IN terminal or to the compact power adapter any electrical equipment that is not expressly recommended for use with this camcorder.
- Do not connect the supplied compact power adapter to voltage converters or special power sources such as those on aircraft, DC-AC inverters, etc.

NOTES

- We recommend charging the battery pack in temperatures between 10 °C and 30 °C. If either the ambient temperature or the battery pack's temperature is outside the range of approx. 0 °C to 40 °C, charging will not start.
- The battery pack will be charged only when the camcorder is off.
- If remaining battery time is an issue, you can power the camcorder using the compact power adapter so the battery pack will not be consumed.
- Charged battery packs continue to discharge naturally. Therefore, charge them on the day of use, or the day before, to ensure a full charge.
- We recommend that you prepare battery packs to last 2 to 3 times longer than you think you might need.

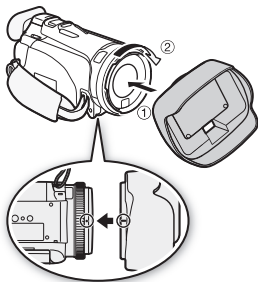

Basic Preparations

Before you begin, make basic adjustments and learn about a few of the frequently-used parts.

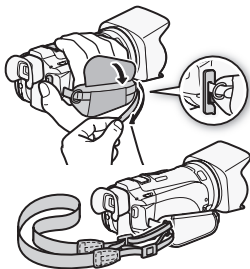
Attaching the lens hood



Place the lens hood on the front of the lens so that the groove on the lens hood is aligned with the bottom of the lens (①), and then turn the lens hood clockwise until it stops with a click (②).

- Be careful not to deform the lens hood.
- Make sure that the lens hood is aligned with the thread.

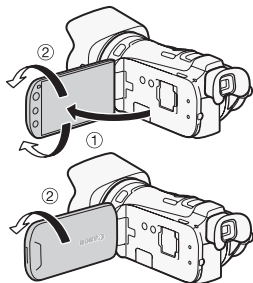
Attaching the grip belt



Fasten the grip belt.

Adjust it so you can reach the zoom lever with your index finger, and the **START/STOP** button with your thumb. You can use the grip belt together with an optional shoulder strap.

Rotating the LCD panel

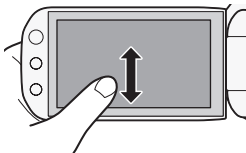


Open the LCD panel and adjust the angle.

- ① Rotate it up to 90 degrees down (for example, to record with your hand extended above a crowd).
- ② Rotate it up to 180 degrees toward the lens (for example, to record video of yourself).
- ③ Pull out the viewfinder to use it.

Using the touch screen



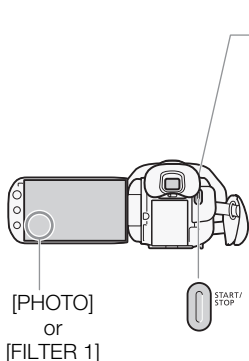
In addition to touching buttons to select items, you can also drag your finger across the screen for operations such as scrolling menus. While applying pressure, swipe your finger across the screen.

You can also use the supplied stylus pen for more precise operations.

Mode switch

Setting the Date/Time and Language

When you turn on the camcorder for the first time, you will need to set the date and time before using the camcorder. You can also change the date format and time zone. (For your convenience, you can do so after changing the language to your preference.)

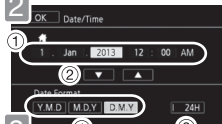

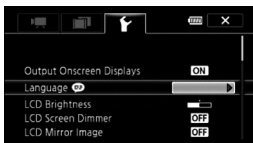

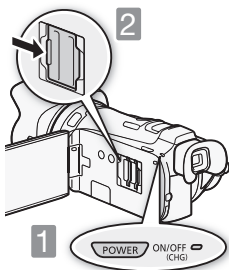

Using a Memory Card

Use commercially available **SD**, **SDHC** (SD High Capacity) or **SDXC** (SD eXtended Capacity) memory cards. Make sure you use a compatible memory card. 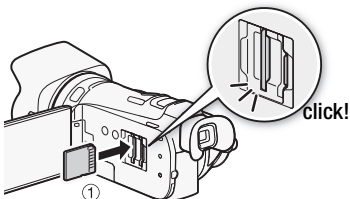

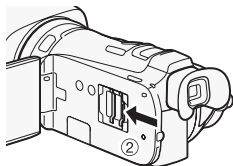

Selecting the memory to use for recording

You can select to record your movies and photos in the built-in memory or on one of the memory cards. The default memory for recording both movies and photos is the built-in memory but you can select the recording memory independently for movies and for photos.

IMPORTANT

- Memory cards have front and back sides that are not interchangeable. Inserting a memory card facing the wrong direction can cause a malfunction of the camcorder.
- For important information regarding the use of SDXC memory cards be sure to refer to *SDXC Memory Cards* ( PDF  32).
- Initialize memory cards when you use them with this camcorder for the first time.

- **To remove the memory card:** Push the memory card once to release it. When the memory card springs out, pull it all the way out.

Shooting Video and Taking Photos

In **AUTO** mode you can easily record movies and photos. You do not need to worry about any settings or menu options - the camcorder will select the most appropriate settings automatically.

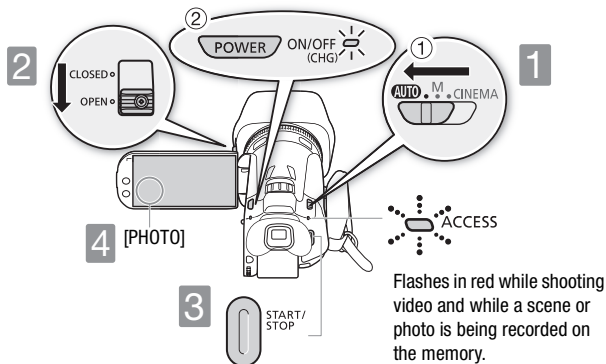
1 Set the camcorder to AUTO mode.

① Set to **AUTO**. ② Press **POWER**.

2 Open the lens barrier. Set to OPEN.

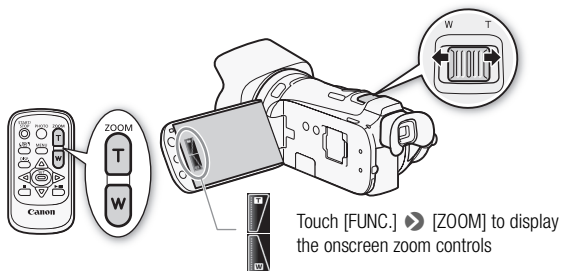
3 Start recording movies. Press to start recording. Press again to pause the recording and record the video on the memory as one scene.

4 Take a photo. Touch [PHOTO] on the screen.
















Use the zoom to frame the subject

Use the zoom lever, the onscreen zoom controls or the zoom buttons on the wireless controller. To zoom out, zoom toward the **W** (wide angle) end. To zoom in, zoom toward the **T** (telephoto) end.



NOTES

- **Smart AUTO mode:** In  mode the camcorder will automatically use the Smart AUTO function so you can get perfect recordings every time. Just point the camcorder and Smart AUTO will automatically select the best settings for your subject and the scene you want to use. One of 38 icons will appear depending on the characteristics of the subject, background, lighting conditions, etc.

- **Intelligent IS:** In  mode, the camcorder will automatically select the best image stabilization setting for the situation.

 - Zoom buttons on the wireless controller: one of three constant speeds.
 - Onscreen zoom controls: depends on where you touch within the zoom control.
 - Zoom lever: variable speed. That is, the zoom speed depends on how you press the lever: press gently for slower zooms; press harder for faster zooms. You can also change the zoom speed to one of three constant speeds.See *Zooming* ( [PDF](#) 52) for details.

- In most situations, keep at least 60 cm away from the subject. The minimum focusing distance at full wide angle is 2 cm.

Quick Start

In a recording mode, you can simply close the LCD panel to set the camcorder in standby mode, which consumes less power and allows the camcorder to use the battery pack longer. During standby mode, the ON/OFF (CHG) indicator will change from green to orange. Open the LCD panel to return the camcorder to record pause mode.

When recording using only the viewfinder, return the viewfinder to its retracted position to set the camcorder in standby mode and pull out the viewfinder when you are ready to resume recording.

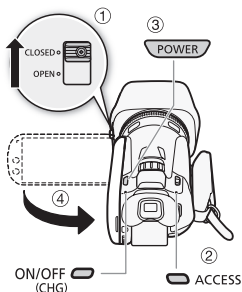

When you have finished recording

Make sure the camcorder has finished writing the scenes or photos on the memory before turning it off.

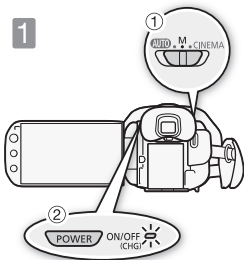
Selecting the Quality of Video

The camcorder offers 5 recording modes (or levels of video quality). Changing the recording mode will change the recording time available on the memory. Select MXP or FXP mode for better movie quality or LP mode for longer recording times.

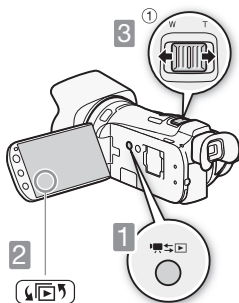

Playing Back Movies and Viewing Photos

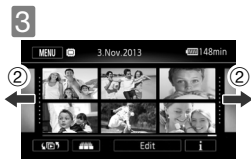
The basic playback screen is the date index screen. You can change the index screen displayed from the [Index Selection] screen. You can also play back complete stories from the gallery.

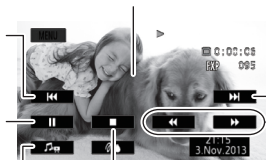

Photos: The selected photo is displayed in single photo view. Drag your finger left/right to browse through the photos one by one. Touch the screen to display the playback controls.

- You may not be able to play back with another device the movies you recorded on the memory card with this camcorder. In such case, play back the movies on the memory card using this camcorder.
- You may not be able to play back with this camcorder movies recorded on a memory card using another device.
- When viewing photos, the following images may not be displayed correctly.
 - Images that were not recorded with this camcorder.
 - Images edited on a computer.
 - Images whose file names have been changed.

NOTES

- When playing back movies, depending on the recording conditions, you may notice brief stops in video or sound playback between scenes.

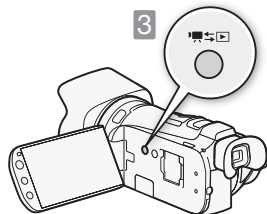
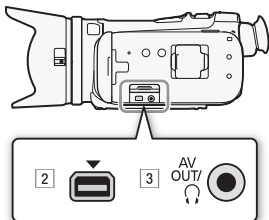
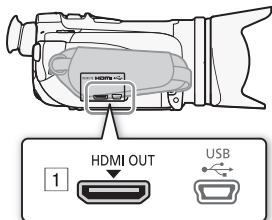
Playback on a TV Screen

Connect your camcorder to a TV to enjoy your recordings with family and friends.

1 Turn off the camcorder and the TV.

2 Connect the camcorder to the TV.

Select the most appropriate connection according to the input terminals on your TV. In decreasing order of picture quality, the connections are: **1** HDMI, **2** Component video, **3** Composite video.



3 Turn on the camcorder.
Press to turn on the camcorder directly in playback mode.

4 Play back your movies or photos as described in the previous pages.

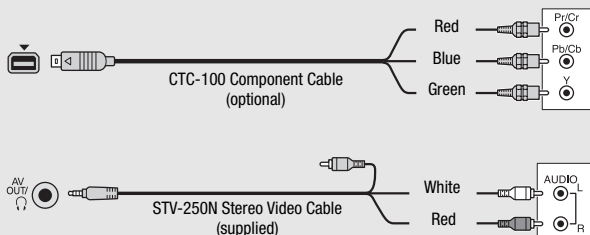

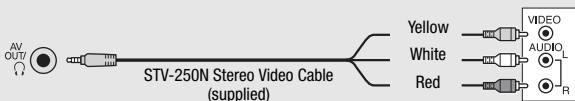

- Adjust the volume using the TV.
- When you play back 16:9 movies on standard TV sets with a 4:3 aspect ratio, the TV set will switch automatically to widescreen mode if it is compatible with the WSS system. Otherwise, change the aspect ratio of the TV manually.
