In addition to printing bordered photos and borderless photos, various printing tasks such as index printing, black and white printing, and printing using ICC profiles are possible.

1. From (Start menu) on the taskbar, select (All apps >) Canon Utilities > Professional Print & Layout.

- In Windows 8.1, select Professional Print & Layout on the Start screen. If Professional Print & Layout is not displayed on the Start screen, select the Search charm, and then search for "Professional Print & Layout."
- In Windows 7, from the Start menu, select All Programs > Canon Utilities > Professional Print & Layout > Professional Print & Layout.

Starting from Digital Photo Professional

- 1. In Digital Photo Professional, select the folder containing the image you want to print.
- 2. Select the image you want to print.

- From the File menu of Digital Photo Professional, select Plug-in printing > Print with Professional Print & Layout.

Starting from Photoshop, Photoshop Elements, or Lightroom

1. Open the image you want to print in Photoshop, Photoshop Elements, or Lightroom.

2. From the File menu, navigate as follows:

Printing Photos

- 1. Start Professional Print & Layout.
- 2. Drag and drop the images you want to print to the Preview area.

You can also select photos from **Open** in the **File** menu.

Important

• If started from Digital Photo Professional, Photoshop, Photoshop Elements, or Lightroom, images cannot be added.

Note

- For available data formats, see <u>Available Data Formats</u>.
- In the Stored Settings area, set the printer and Layout Mode you want to use, and other settings.
- **4.** In **Print Settings** on the **General Settings** tab, set **Media Type**, **Paper Source**, **Print Quality**, and other settings.



Important

• When **Plain Papers** is selected for **Media Type**, the print result may become faint. In that case, change the **Media Type** and print.

Note Note

• The displayed paper sizes and media types vary depending on your printer.

- For the types of third party paper supported by PRO-1000 series, PRO-500 series, PRO-G1 series, and PRO-S1 series printers, refer to Art Paper Printing Guide. Art Paper Printing Guide can be downloaded from our website.
- Available paper sources and print quality vary depending on your printer and paper.
- For Print Settings on the General Settings tab, see General Settings Tab (Print Settings).
- 5. In Layout on the General Settings tab, set the layout you want to use.

Printing with Impression Close to That on Monitor


You can print with an impression close to that on the monitor by correctly reflecting the characteristics of the data displayed on the monitor.

Important

- To print with an impression close to that on the monitor, we recommend that you set the monitor and ambient light as follows.
 - Monitor
 - Color temperature: D50 (5000 K)
 - Luminance: 120 cd/m2
 - Gamma: 2.2
 - Ambient light
 - D50 fluorescent lamps designed for color evaluation (color temperature: 5000 K, high color rendering properties)
 - Brightness when viewing printed materials: 500 lx ± 125 lx
- **1.** Start Professional Print & Layout, and then drag and drop the images you want to print to the Preview area.

- In Color Management on the General Settings tab, set Color Mode to Use ICC Profile or Driver Matching.



Select a color mode according to the color space of the image to be printed. Canon recommends the following combinations.

Color Space	Color Mode
Adobe RGB	Use ICC Profile (Rendering Intent: Perceptual)
sRGB	Driver Matching (Rendering Intent: Perceptual (Photo))

Printing Using ICC Profiles

By specifying an ICC profile, you can print according to the paper to be used or print by utilizing the color space of the image developed or corrected in Adobe RGB or sRGB.

1. Start Professional Print & Layout, and then drag and drop the images you want to print to the Preview area.

- For how to start Professional Print & Layout, see Starting Professional Print & Layout.
- 2. In Color Management on the General Settings tab, set Color Mode to Use ICC Profile.



Printing Borderless Photos

You can print borderless photos.

In Print Settings on the General Settings tab, select the Borderless Printing checkbox, and then print.



- You can set the amount of extension in **Amount of extension for borderless printing** in the <u>Other</u> <u>Settings dialog box</u>.
- Borderless photos can be set only when roll paper is selected for Paper Source.

Printing an Index


You can print an index of selected images.

It is highly recommended for organizing images since you can view images in a list.

1. Start Professional Print & Layout, and then drag and drop the images you want to print to the Preview area.

- 2. In the Stored Settings area, select Multiple Images for Layout Mode.



3. In Layout on the General Settings tab, select Index Pattern Settings for Registered Layouts.

The Index Pattern Settings dialog box appears.

4. Set Rows and Columns, and then click OK.

- Up to 100 (10 x 10) images can be printed on a sheet of paper.
- · You can set the position and size of the slot. For details, see Adjusting Margins and Slot Sizes.
- 5. Click Print.

The **Print** dialog box appears.

6. Click OK.

• For Layout on the General Settings tab, see General Settings Tab (Layout).


Printing by Arranging Freely

Arrange multiple images freely making use of the entire roll paper.

This is convenient when printing many images since they are automatically arranged apart from each other according to the roll paper width.

>>>> Note

- This function is available only for models supporting roll paper.
- 1. Start Professional Print & Layout.
- 2. In the Stored Settings area, select Multiple Images (Auto Nesting) for Layout Mode.



Important

- If you select **Multiple Images (Auto Nesting)** after placing images, the slot size returns to the default. The default can be set on the **Layout** tab of the <u>Other Settings dialog box</u>.
- 3. In Print Settings on the General Settings tab, set Roll Paper Width.

>>>> Note

- If the current roll paper width is not displayed, click **Get Information**, and then obtain the information from the printer.
- 4. Drag and drop the images you want to print to the Preview area.

The images are arranged automatically.

>>>> Note

• If you click (Slot Auto Nesting) after manually changing the positions and sizes of images, the images will be arranged automatically according to their current positions and sizes.

5. Click Print.


The **Print** dialog box appears.

- The roll paper length required for printing is displayed in the **Print** dialog box.
- 6. Click OK.

Printing with Crop Marks

Print with crop marks.

In Layout on the General Settings tab, select the Show Crop Marks checkbox, and then print.

Print color images in black and white. You can also print photos shot in black and white or data converted to black and white in image editing software.

- 1. Drag and drop the images you want to print to the Preview area.
- 2. In Color Management on the General Settings tab, select Black and White Photo for Color Mode.



Adjusting Tones of Black and White Photos

When printing a black and white image, you can specify a tone to adjust its color tone. You can also make a fine adjustment to the color tone.



A: Cool Tone

A cool bluish tone

B: Black and White

A tone that looks like an achromatic color

C: Warm Tone

A warm yellowish tone

- 1. Drag and drop the images you want to print to the Preview area.
- In Color Management on the General Settings tab, select Black and White Photo for Color Mode.
- 3. In Color Settings on the Color Settings tab, select tone for Tone.


- If the result of printing after adjusting the color tone is different from what is displayed in print preview, perform Pattern Print and adjust the color again, using the pattern as a reference.
 - Adjusting Color Tones of Black and White Photos by Viewing Patterns
- When the **Darken white areas in photo** checkbox is selected, the highlights in the image will be darkened to make it easier to distinguish the boundary between the image and the paper.
- To change the brightness or contrast, see Adjusting Color Balance, Brightness, and Contrast.

Adjusting Color Tones of Black and White Photos by Viewing Patterns

Adjust the color tone of a black and white photo by printing and viewing a pattern with which you can check the color tones of the black and white photo.

Important

- This function is unavailable when **Gallery Wrap** is selected for **Layout Mode** in the **Stored Settings** area.
- **1.** In the Preview area, select the image of which you want to print a pattern.
- 2. In Color Settings on the Color Settings tab, click Pattern Print....



The Pattern Print window appears.

- 3. Select Paper Size according to the paper to be used for Pattern Print.
- 4. Select Tone X/Y in Color.

5. Select Pattern Size and Color Variation between Instances.

6. Finely adjust the color tone in Color Settings as needed.

The pattern is printed.

- **9.** From the printed pattern, enter the values described under the image with the desired color tone into the X-coordinate and Y-coordinate.
- 10. Click OK in the Pattern Print window.

The **Pattern Print** window closes; the values are reflected in the black and white color tone adjustment space in the main screen.

- To perform Pattern Print only for a portion of the image, display the **Pattern Print** window after following the steps below.
 - 1. In the main screen, duplicate the image of which you want to print a pattern.
 - 2. <u>Crop</u> the duplicate image.

After completing Pattern Print and adjustment, delete the duplicate image.

• For the **Pattern Print** window, see <u>Pattern Print Window</u>.

Adjusting Color Balance, Brightness, and Contrast

Adjust the color tones of images by specifying the color balance, brightness, and contrast.



>>>> Important

- Adjustments to the color balance, brightness, and contrast apply to all the images to be printed. To adjust each image individually, we recommend that you use image editing software.
- The results of adjustments in Professional Print & Layout will only be reflected in the printed materials and not in the image data.
- **1.** Drag and drop the images you want to print to the Preview area.
- 2. In Color Settings on the Color Settings tab, adjust Brightness and Contrast.



>>>> Note

• If the result of printing after adjusting the brightness/contrast is different from what is displayed in print preview, perform Pattern Print and adjust the color again, using the pattern as a reference.

Adjusting Brightness/Contrast by Viewing Patterns

- For Brightness, move the slider to the right to brighten and left to darken.
- For Contrast, move the slider to the right to increase and left to decrease the contrast.
- You can also set by entering a value directly.

3. Adjust Color Balance.



Important

 The color balance cannot be set if Black and White Photo is selected for Color Mode in Color Management on the General Settings tab. If you select Black and White Photo after changing the color balance, the changed color balance will be discarded.

• If the result of printing after adjusting the color balance is different from what is displayed in print preview, perform Pattern Print and adjust the color again, using the pattern as a reference.

Adjusting Color Balance by Viewing Patterns

- Move the slider to the right to emphasize and left to weaken the color tone.
- You can also set by entering a value directly.

Adjusting Brightness/Contrast by Viewing Patterns

Adjust the brightness and contrast by printing and viewing a pattern with which you can check the brightness and contrast of the image.



 - 1. In the main screen, duplicate the image of which you want to print a pattern.
 - 2. <u>Crop</u> the duplicate image.

After completing Pattern Print and adjustment, delete the duplicate image.

Adjusting Color Balance by Viewing Patterns

Adjust the color balance by printing and viewing a pattern with which you can check the color balance of the image.




